Pakistan Bridge Federation

Pakistan Bridge Federation (PBF) was formed in 1972 as Pakistan Bridge Association. It is the national governing body for all competitive bridge tournaments and oversees development of the sport in Pakistan. In 1981, it became a founding member of the Bridge Federation of Africa, Asia & the Middle East (BFAAME), which is now known as the Bridge Federation of Asia & the Middle East (BFAME).

About Karachi

Karachi is the largest city, main seaport and the financial capital of Pakistan, and the capital of the province of Sindh. It is the 3rd largest city in the world in terms of population and is Pakistan's premier centre of banking, industry, and trade.
