## **Cavendish Teams and Pairs Results**

Earlier this month, in Las Vegas, the 24<sup>th</sup> Microsoft Internet Gaming Zone Cavendish Invitational tournament was held. This year's event was sponsored by Microsoft Corporation, on behalf of their new Internet Gaming Zone (Canada's Fred Gitelman wrote the software for the new free Internet bridge site, which operates much like OKBridge). As usual, the field was star-studded. Below are the final rankings in the three-session team event, while those for the pair event can be found on the next page. ## The Generali Masters

The Generali Masters Tournament is held every two years in Europe. This, the fourth edition, was held in April in Ajaccio, Corsica. This delightful venue, the birthplace of Napoleon Bonaparte, was well-known to WBF President José Damiani, who was instrumental in developing the ongoing relationship with Generali Insurance, one of the great companies of Europe. Invitations were much-coveted by the world's best players, but there were only so many to go around, and although several familiar faces were missing, both fields were very strong. All the players employed the same standard-style methods so there was never a need to ask questions and the play moved along at an excellent pace. There were no appeals.

In the Open event (52 players, four sessions), the event went down to the wire and in fact, was decided on the last deal when the inimitable Paul Chemla of France guessed a king-jack combination correctly. Had he not done so, the title would have gone to Apolinary Kowalski of Poland. Great Britain's Andy Robson finished a solid third. First prize in the Men's was 50,000 francs.

In the Women's event, Israel's Migri Zur-Albu was in contention all the way and a strong final session saw her home with the title. Veronique Bessis of France was second, Sandra Landy of Great Britain third. Ruth Porat-Levit of Israel, Migri's partner, was leading for much of the three-session event, but slipped to fourth near the end. A great showing for Israel nonetheless.

In both fields, there were prizes for the top half of the field and sportsmanship was wonderful throughout. The bridge world needs more of these events, which bring traditional rivals together for a few deals and create a marvelous ambience for everyone.

The Closing Dinner was held at a beautiful restaurant in Ajaccio and the evening was highlighted by the performance of some local folk singers and the cameo appearances of Gabriel Chagas and Omar Sharif, who were in fine voice. Not only the women cried.

## **PABF OPEN TEAMS**

The top four teams will qualify for the semifinals, which begin on the evening of May 22 at 8:30 pm, following the second round round robin. The round robin stage winners will earn the right to select their opponents for the 64-board semifinals. The 64-board final begins the following evening at 9:10 pm.


